#### Ward Audits

### Winter Flu

As we continue to see significant numbers of patients with flu, please keep in mind when you are volunteering at the hospital that there may be barrier nursing on the wards and greater pressure on hospital. To help protect the spread of the flu to the vulnerable patients on the ward, you can still visit a local vaccination clinic to have a vaccination.

If you are feeling unwell on your volunteering day, please let us know as it's important for you to stay at home, rest and recuperate.

### Use new activity box and help #End PJ Paralysis

Sitting in a chair to eat a meal, taking a stroll down the ward, or spending time in the ward day room can all help #EndPJParalysis. The #EndPJParalysis campaign aims to keep patients more active and independent as there is danger of the deconditioning of elderly and frail patients who stay in a bed for a long period of time. Statistically, in patients over 80, lack of mobilisation for just 10 days will result in the equivalent of 10 years of muscle aging.

Our new activity box is a fantastic resource for ward volunteers and can be used to encourage patients to get up and about. There are lots of things for patients to do ranging from quizzes and word searches, jigsaw puzzles, and some 'brain teasers' 3D puzzles. To provide a little escapism, there is a personal CD player and comedy, plays, short stories, poetry plus of course some music CDs. In addition there are 2 reminiscence books which our patients with dementia area likely to find particularly appealing. Just ask one of the office team and we'll explain what you need to do e.g. sign the box out etc.



There will be a book sale held in the Concourse from 10.00 to 15.00 on Thursday 8<sup>th</sup> February. All books available are in good condition and proceeds from the sale will enable new books to be purchased for inpatients to borrow and to improve patient experience.
