## Great Cambridge Partnership travel consultation

The Greater Cambridge Partnership has launched a consultation on proposals to transform how people travel in, out and around Cambridge. Central to the proposals are improvements to bus travel as well as more investment in better walking and cycling routes. The changes proposed would be paid for upfront by the GCP and phased in over four years before the proposed introduction of a Sustainable Travel Zone with a road user charge.

CUH recognises the need to improve sustainable transport options and will be providing a response to the consultation as well as contributing to a biomedical campus response.

The GCP will also be visiting the concourse on Wednesday 16<sup>th</sup> November where you can find out more about the proposals.
