




Sad loss of long serving volunteer

We were deeply saddened to learn of the recent passing of a long-standing member of the CUH family, Lewin volunteer Tina.

Tina joined Addenbrooke's 40 years ago as an auxiliary nurse (as they were then known) on the Rehab unit. She took on many patient support and fundraising tasks and in time a new post was created for her as the "Patient Support Coordinator". One of her colleagues from that time recalled that Tina was crucial in patients' recovery, organising day trips to the seaside, games and generally liaising with families.

When she reached retirement age she then spent many years working as a volunteer on the Lewin ward (as it had become), as a guide and within the Bereavement Support service. She regularly helped with the hospital medical students exams when patients were needed. She
