When will playwrights write for older women, who can still learn lines? Rosemary, Volunteer Reader




So you can imagine how pleased I was to be cast in an Agatha Christie play "And Then There Were None". Quite a formidable lady and fun to play. This is going to be staged by St John's Players at the Fulbourn Centre in Fulbourn from 25th to 28th October at 7.30pm. Interestingly the same play is on at the Arts Theatre two weeks later, a rare occurrence as normally the publishers will not allow amateur performances at the same time as professional tours. We of the cast are intrigued to see how they

present it, as were are performing the play with Agatha Christie's original book ending. When the play script was written by Agatha Christie herself in the 1940s, it was first performed during WW2, she was asked to provide a more happy ending to lift peoples spirits. We however now have the original book ending script.

Any amateur production relies heavily of a few dedicated people backstage who deign and build the sets, hang up the lights and doing all the sound recording. The set is elaborate and to put it onto the small stage at the Fulbourn Centre is going to be challenge. But it seems our backstage team love a challenge, and certainly have no such luxuries as are found at the Arts Theatre to help them.

So as the nights draw in and get colder why not come along, sit back and relax and see if you can work out who is killing off the "Ten Little Soldiers". Our cast have been working hard on the play and would love your support.



From this Sunday, 29 October, Stagecoach will be making changes to some of their timetables on routes across Cambridgeshire, Bedfordshire and Peterborough. - Citi I, Arbury Fulbourn
 - Additional morning journey Monday Saturday. This early service will leave Arbury towards Fulbourn at 04:55.
- Citi 2, Addenbrooke's Milton
 - o Minor tweaks to improve reliability on weekend services.
- Milton Park & Ride, Milton Cambridge
 - o Minor tweaks to improve reliability.
 - o On outbound journeys, Landbeach will be served every 30 minutes.
- New 25a route, Trumpington Park & Ride-Biomedical Campus

Introducing a new 25a service which will operate at peak morning and afternoon times, with a direct route between Trumpington Park & Ride and the Biomedical Campus.

CUH staff and volunteer NHS health check

Occupational Health and Wellbeing are pleased to offer the CUH staff NHS health check clinic. This service is available to residents registered with a GP in Cambridgeshire or Peterborough aged between 40 – 74 years.

The NHS Health Check covers various aspects of your general health, including height, weight, age, sex, ethnicity, blood pressure, cholesterol, and HbAIc. You can learn more about eligibility criteria and the purpose of an **NHS Health Check on the NHS website here**.

What you can expect:

- 20-30 minute appointment.
- Immediate results shared with your GP.
- Advice on how to improve your health.
- Assistance in getting specialist support if needed.

Appointments are scheduled for the last Wednesday of each month and are held at the **Occupational Health and Wellbeing building**.

Cambridge Children's Hospital reaches key milestone

Cambridge Children's Hospital has been given the green light to proceed to the final stage of its business case development.

The Outline Business Case for the new hospital was approved in principle by NHS England and the Department of Health and Social Care on 29 September.

Pre-construction works can also proceed on the site of the hospital, opposite the Rosie, early next year.

Thank you to all staff who have been involved in getting the project to this stage and lending your expertise to plan the first specialist children's hospital for the East of England. In



the next business case stage, the project team will develop the plans to integrate mental and physical healthcare, and the knowledge and experience of our staff will be key to these conversations again.

Look out for the details of pop-up stands at all three partner organisations next month so you can come along to meet the team and find out what you want to know about the project.
