Building for the future – Histopathology update

Our CUH Strategy – Together 2025 – sets out our ambitious plans to invest in the development of new hospitals and facilities to improve care for patients locally, regionally and nationally. One of our key commitments was to re-provide accommodation for the CUH Histopathology service.

The service is now preparing to move to a brand new state-of-the-art facility as part of a £34 million modernisation project to deliver faster, more efficient diagnostic results for our patients.

This will futureproof the service to ensure it can meet the growing demand in the years to come and support our two new hospitals, the Cambridge Cancer Research Hospital and Cambridge Children's

Hospital.

The new lab will occupy a floor within a brand-new building – named 1,000 Discovery Drive – on the Cambridge Biomedical Campus. It will bring long-term cost savings by enabling investment in digital technology and innovation. It also brings new opportunities for staff training and opportunities to capitalise on the skills of our specialist staff to undertake ground-breaking research.

Construction on the main building is now complete, a fit ——out process to transform the space will begin later this year, and the service is expected to go live at the new facility in the Spring 2025.
