Focus on..... Changing Climate, Changing Hospital

Katie Sell, CUH Sustainability Manager, explains how our hospital is taking action

In line with the rest of the NHS, CUH has a priority stake in taking action to tackle the climate emergency. A warming world, combined with a rapidly unfolding ecological crisis, is a threat to everyone's health and wellbeing. This will put pressure on our hospitals' capacity, premises, supporting infrastructure and supply chain.

In 2022 the Trust launched its first Green Plan with a target of: i.) cutting its direct carbon emissions by 10% by the end of 2024 (from a 2019/20 baseline) and, ii.) diverting as much waste as possible away from landfill or incineration. In a nutshell, this means the hospital site moving away from burning fossil fuels and a take-make-use-dispose way of consuming goods (known as the 'linear economy' deeply unsustainable), to using energy as efficiently as possible whilst switching to renewable sources, and optimising reuse, repair and high value recycling (known as the 'circular economy' - inherently much more sustainable).

Our first Green Plan has delivered really well on its targets, and we are now drafting Green Plan 2 (2025-27). The objectives here are immensely challenging but we have a strong base.

By 2030/32 we need to have:

- Grown our current 10% reduction in direct carbon emissions to 50%, and
- Made it standard practice, wherever possible, to purchase reusable, repairable, refillable, and items that can be readily remanufactured.

The new plan must get us well on the way to making this happen.

2. Use reusables when onsite

When you're onsite, everything you consume and throw away is taken into account when we calculate the Trust's carbon footprint. To reduce your personal impact on CUH's carbon emissions (and your personal one on the planet), please use reusables as much as possible. This includes coffee cups, water bottles, cutlery etc...

3. Assess how you travel

How you travel to work is also taken into account when we calculate our transport carbon emissions as a Trust. If you drive in, assess whether there is scope to change. Could you get the bus? Train? Cycle? Walk? Carpool? Not only does active and public transport lower your carbon emissions, it is also better for your wellbeing and physical health.

4. Support the Volunteers' own Think Green Impact

The CUH Volunteering team are currently a member of the CUH Think Green Impact programme which allows staff to make direct changes to their work area to be more sustainable. Why not help them out with these actions! The team wins awards for each level they complete.
